Stephen Sheller Recognized by U.S. Commanding General for Iraq for support of Pennsylvania National Guard

PHILADELPHIA - Stephen Sheller, Sheller, P.C. founding partner, was recently recognized by U.S. Commanding General for Iraq, Raymond T. Odierno for his continued support of and dedication to the Pennsylvania National Guard.

“I believe our soldiers are due far more gratitude than they have received” says Sheller. “We must take greater steps to recognize their contributions to our country. What I’ve done, I urge others to do--be more involved in supporting and thanking those that serve.”

The inscription on the flag case and framed award reads:

“This flag of the United States of America was flown on the grounds of the U.S. Embassy, Baghdad, Iraq, on April 15, 2010 in recognition of support to the troops of Operation Iraqi Freedom.”

The renowned “Keystone Division” of the Pennsylvania National Guard is the oldest continuously serving division in the U.S. Army, and has served throughout all of our nation’s major conflicts. The 28th Infantry Division of the Pennsylvania National Guard is one of the Army’s most battle-tested divisions, and has had more soldiers killed in action in Iraq and Afghanistan than any other state’s National Guard unit in the country. Presently, several thousand of these “super citizen soldiers” are deployed in Iraq and Afghanistan.
